
"As realtors we earn our living from the local community," Steinberg said. "We decided to do something to give back to the local community and that's how this came about."

PEMBERTON TOWNSHIP SCHOOLS PARTICIPATES IN RED RIBBON WEEK

Representatives from the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and the Presidential Lakes Civic Association collaborated to provide a special presentation for students at Pemberton Township High School and Helen A. Fort Middle School to raise awareness on the dangers of fentanyl on Thursday, October 26th. The two organizations also emphasized the importance of finding passion in positive activities during their presentation.

According to the DEA's website, the organization seized more than 59.6 million fentanyl-laced fake pills and more than 13,000 pounds of fentanyl powder in 2022. Those numbers are equivalent to more than 395 million lethal doses of fentanyl.

The Presidential Lakes Civic Association's presentation focused on the ongoing fentanyl epidemic affecting communities across America, and provided students with drug-free alternatives to remain healthy and safe.

The drug awareness assemblies at each school were a part of the annual Red Ribbon Week initiative. Red Ribbon Week is celebrated each year in the U.S. from October 23 through October 31. It highlights the importance of living a drug-free life and provides an opportunity for communities, educators, and parents to emphasize the dangers of drug use to their children.
