The best person to start with is the person you feel most comfortable with; because we’re all different we have different experiences, and the people we connect with may vary.

Once you’ve identified the person you feel most comfortable with, you can trust that they are going to do their best to steer you in the right direction. Nowadays practically every adult working in a school had been trained on how to support and direct students – so you shouldn’t have to worry about saying anything that will cause them to freak out.
